

CLANDONALD COMMUNITY PROFILE



The Hamlet of Clandonald is located in Division 7 in the Northwest area of the County of Vermilion River. It is a peaceful agriculture based community.

Clandonald is the "Little Hamlet with Lots of Heart" and is home to 107 residents (according to the 2015 municipal Census). It is 24 km northeast of Vermilion; 17 km west of Dewberry and 80 km northwest of Lloydminster.

COMMUNITY

- **Education:** students are able to attend Clandonald School (1-6) and are bussed to Vermilion for Junior & High School (7-12). The schools are part of the Buffalo Trails School Division. There is also a privately run kindergarten program
- **Transportation:** Clandonald is accessible by secondary Highways 41 and 45 (north of Highway 16), allowing for convenient travel and transportation access for both residents and any commercial/industrial ventures.
- **Services:** residents are serviced with municipal water, sewer and natural gas infrastructure; and have road maintenance monitored and managed by the County. Fire and emergency services located directly in Clandonald respond to 911 calls.
- **Recreation:** Clandonald is home to a community hall, 10 powered campsites, ball diamond, gun range, indoor arena, and holds an annual summer fair. In nearby Vermilion and Dewberry there is access to further recreation facilities such as curling, swimming pool, soccer fields, provincial park with campground and more.
- **Groups & Support:** there are a couple of community based groups in Clandonald including: Friends of Clandonald Sustainability Foundation, and the Clandonald Agricultural Society.

BUSINESS & EMPLOYMENT

- Primary industry is agriculture, with a growth in oil and gas. There are several businesses based in Clandonald including Canada Post, Clandonald Country Store, Don's Bottle Depot and the Seed Cleaning Plant.
- Larger urban centers nearby include the Village of Dewberry, Town of Vermilion, Town of Elk Point and City of Lloydminster. These centers are home to many more key service providers and potential employers/employees
- There is an opportunity in the hamlet and region for light commercial/industrial and residential development
