- Can respond to emergencies when available, with preference to those that are free during day-time hours.
- Enjoy a challenge and strive in high-energy environments with constantly changing situations, differing call volumes and periods of intense work.
- Are motivated to help their communities and make the County a safe place to reside.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON BECOMING A VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER:

The County of Vermilion River Fire Services are evolving, modern departments that work together to fight fires, rescue victims and competently respond to many other types of emergencies. The nature of the work provides variety, ensuring that no one call is ever the same. Being involved in the community, in all aspects of providing fire protection, ranges from dealing with house fires to talking to school age children about fire safety. Being part of a station will increase your social circle, boost your life skills and expose you to rewarding experiences not often gained from a regular job.

The work of a Volunteer Firefighter can be very demanding, often responding to emergencies at all hours of the day or night (when available), including weekends and holidays. You will attend calls in adverse weather conditions and deal with the public during times of personal loss and emotional crisis. As such, this position requires candidates to be mentally and physically apt.

Internationally recognized training, incredible exposure to the emergency services world, pay and compensation for hours worked and the satisfaction of knowing you are keeping your community safe. It also comes with a cool hat.
