SEPTEMBER 30, 2022**

REMINDER: All taxes are due September 30, 2022. All taxes remaining unpaid after the due date of September 30 will have a penalty of 8% imposed the day after the due date. A further 12% penalty will be imposed on outstanding balances not paid by January 16, 2023.

TAX INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PLAN (TIPP)

What is TIPP?

The monthly tax payment plan allows taxpayers to make automatic monthly payments for property taxes rather than a single annual payment.



How does TIPP work?

TIPP runs from January to December each year with the first payment starting January 15.

The first six monthly payments are based on the previous year's tax levy. As a result of increases or decreases to the annual levy, changes to installment amounts will be effective for the last six payments of the year.

Payments may only be made by automatic withdrawal from your bank account at a financial institution. A direct withdrawal form must be completed before participation in the plan. The County of Vermilion River does not charge for this service.

What are the benefits of TIPP?

Monthly installments divide the large payments into smaller payments to make monthly budgeting easier. Participants are not subject to late payment penalties.

Who can sign up for TIPP?

Any registered owner can sign up for TIPP if they meet the following requirements:

1. Your tax account is paid up to date (including any installments due prior to signing up as well as any arrears on the account).
2. If you have banking privileges at a financial institution.

How can I get set up on the Tax Installment Payment Plan?

You must complete the Tax Installment Payment Plan Form and include a VOID cheque.

Once completed, this form authorizes the County of Vermilion River to draw and issue payment to the County of Vermilion River for your property taxes. Payments will be automatically withdrawn on the 15th day of each month or the next business day if the 15th occurs on a weekend or holiday.

Withdrawal/Non-Payment

You may withdraw from the plan at any time by giving written notice at least 15 business days before the next payment date. At time of withdrawal, all outstanding taxes become due and are subject to penalties in accordance with the County of Vermilion River bylaw.

Any payment that is returned from your financial institution is subject to a N.S.F. fee and may result in termination of the plan. If termination occurs, all outstanding taxes become due and are subject to penalties in accordance with the County of Vermilion River bylaws.

What happens if I sell my property during the year?

When your property is sold, participants are requested to inform the County of Vermilion River in writing at least two weeks in advance of the next payment. All installment payments are non-refundable and non-transferrable. If you sell your property, we can provide your solicitor with the most recent tax levy and the total installment payments made to date in the current year.

If you have purchased a new property within the County of Vermilion River and wish to continue to be enrolled in the TIPP program, please reapply with a new TIPP form and a VOID cheque.

NOTE: Current participants do not need to reapply.

FERAL PIGS

Feral pigs (Wild Boar at-large) are one of the most damaging invasive species in North America—and, unfortunately, they are present in the County of Vermilion River.

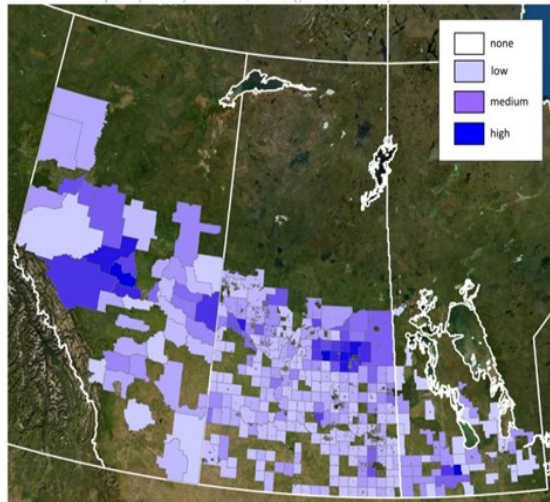


While some people enjoy hunting wild boar at-large, this is not an effective control option. Hunting removes a few individual animals, but also trains the rest of the pigs in the group (called a "sunder") to avoid hunters, making them harder to control in the future.

We need your help to report sightings of wild boar at-large and any damage they have caused. 2022 PEST SURVEILLANCE

Clubroot of Canola: Survey starts later August and runs through harvest. County Pest Inspectors check 200 randomly selected canola fields in the County for Clubroot.

Canola Disease Survey: Conducted in August/September, in conjunction with the Clubroot survey. Staff assess blackleg, sclerotinia and clubroot on 16 fields for Alberta Agriculture's pest surveillance program.

Wheat Disease Survey: Survey conducted in August/September. Staff collect head samples from 14 fields and submit to Alberta Agriculture's pest surveillance program.

DID YOU KNOW?

Landowners/managers are responsible for managing and controlling weeds on their property. The Weed Control Act 2010 is a Provincial Act enforced by municipalities. The Act designates specific plant species that must be managed or controlled.

Prohibited noxious weeds are not yet widely established in Alberta, but have been identified as weeds in other jurisdictions and may be found invading some sites. These plants can spread very quickly and are highly competitive. You are required to destroy all parts of prohibited noxious weeds, including their seeds, to prevent their establishment.

Noxious weeds are found throughout Alberta and are not likely to be eradicated. However, you must use reasonable means to prevent their spread. This means that while you may not have to eliminate the plants, you must prevent seeds or roots from spreading.

ENVIRONMENTAL FARM PLANS (EFP)

The voluntary and free Environmental Farm Plan (EFP) helps farmers highlight their commitment to environmental stewardship on their land. The program covers the whole farm using a self-assessment tool to help the producer identify on-farm environmental risks.

The Environmental Farm Plan is a practical way to view your entire farm through a different operational lens. The EFP process helps you to easily think through basic factors on your farm, such as soils, water, inputs, waste, energy use, and many other facets of your operation. At the completion of the process, your farm has an itemized list of improvements that you can choose to implement on your operation. The EFP is a useful tool for analyzing a farming operation and guiding improvements

Fire Prevention Week is October 9 to 15, 2022

Fire won't wait. Plan your escape.

Plan ahead! If a fire breaks out in your home, you may have only a few minutes (or less) to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if there is a fire.

HOME FIRE ESCAPE PLAN

- **MAKE** a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your home.
- **KNOW** at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- **HAVE** an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- **PRACTICE** your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.
- **PRACTICE** using different ways out.
- **TEACH** children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- **MEMORIZE** your address in case you ever need to call 911. For rural properties, this is the green sign located at the entry of your driveway or approach.
- **CLOSE** doors behind you as you leave.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS

- If the smoke alarm sounds, **GET OUT AND STAY OUT**. Never go back inside for people and pets.
- If you have to escape through smoke, **GET LOW AND GO** under the smoke to your way out.
- **CALL** the fire department from outside your home.

Rural address signs covered with vegetation or other obstructions may cause a delay for responding emergency crews. Please ensure that your rural address sign has a clear view from the roadway.

2022 ROAD PROJECTS

Crews are still working hard to complete the road projects for the year. So far the CVR Rehabilitation Crews have completed 18.8km of road repair.

They are currently working on:

- TWP 500 from RR 54 to RR 61 (3.6km left)
- RR 62 between TWP 511 and TWP 513 (total 3.2km)

Road Improvements by Border Paving are still underway:

- TWP 503 from RR 70 to HWY 41 (total 1.6km)
- RR 70 from TWP 503 to HWY 16 (total 1.6km)
- TWP 500 from RR 71 to HWY 41 (total 3.2km)
- Hamlet of Blackfoot North to TWP 502 (total 1.98km)
- RR 12 from TWP 502A to TWP 504 (total 2.4km)

Minor bridge maintenance on RR 80 and TWP 511 scheduled for Fall 2022.

The County provides snow plowing from the approach to the residence for those that purchase an annual snow plow flag for access only (this **does not** include plowing to barns, corrals, etc.).

How to purchase a flag:

- Fill out a waiver (new one each season)
- Fee of \$200 for Ratepayers & Buffalo Trails School Division Yard service "Parental Choice" and \$50 for Senior (65 yrs+) or Disabled Person (must have a disability #)
- Buffalo Trails School Division Essential Turn Around provided at no cost ****still requires a waiver to be filled out and signed by resident****
- If you have a **Red** or **Green** flag from last year, place it at the end of your driveway. The grader operator will pick it up.

Snow Plowing Priorities:

1. Main Roads
2. Bus Routes
3. Other Grid Roads
4. Yard Sites (with snow plow flags only)

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Winterize Your Water Lines in the Fall

1. Turn off water to outdoor faucets and drain the water lines
2. Insulate the exposed water lines in the basement and crawl spaces
3. Make sure the heat tape is plugged in and working under your mobile home and skirting is up and closed off to the elements
4. Disconnect outdoor hoses
5. Cover hose spigot
6. Blow out underground sprinklers

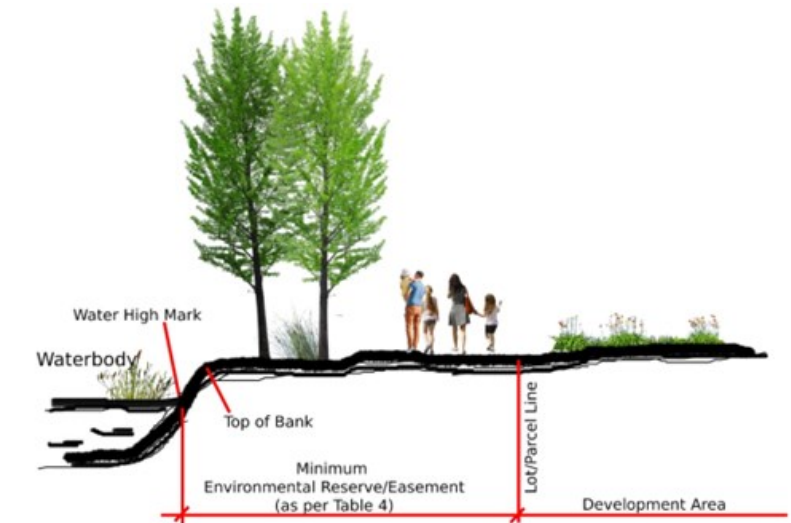

DEVELOPMENT NEAR WETLANDS

What is a Wetland?

Wetlands are "land saturated with water long enough to promote formation of water altered soils, growth of water tolerant vegetation, and various kinds of biological activity that are adapted to the wet environment."



County of Vermilion River Land Use Bylaw:

An environmental reserve or Easement from the high-water mark of water bodies and/or the top of bank of lakes and rivers shall be required as a condition of Subdivision approval. The Use of Conservation Easements may be considered as an alternative to traditional environmental reserve during the Subdivision process

The developer shall be required to avoid wetlands wherever possible, to mitigate the extent of the disturbance on wetlands when avoidance is not possible, and when avoidance and mitigation are not possible to construct an equivalent wetland facility to replace the wetland that was destroyed through development. To be environmentally sustainable, "no net loss" of wetlands is greatly considered.



QUICK FACTS

The goal of the Alberta Wetland Policy (2013) is to conserve, restore, protect, and manage Alberta's wetlands to sustain the benefits they provide to the environment, society, and economy.

To achieve this goal, the policy focuses on 4 outcomes:

- 1) Wetlands of highest value are protected for the long-term benefits of Albertans
- 2) Wetlands and their benefits are conserved and restored in areas where losses have been high
- 3) Wetlands are managed by avoiding, minimizing, and if necessary, replacing lost wetland value.
- 4) Wetland management considers regional context

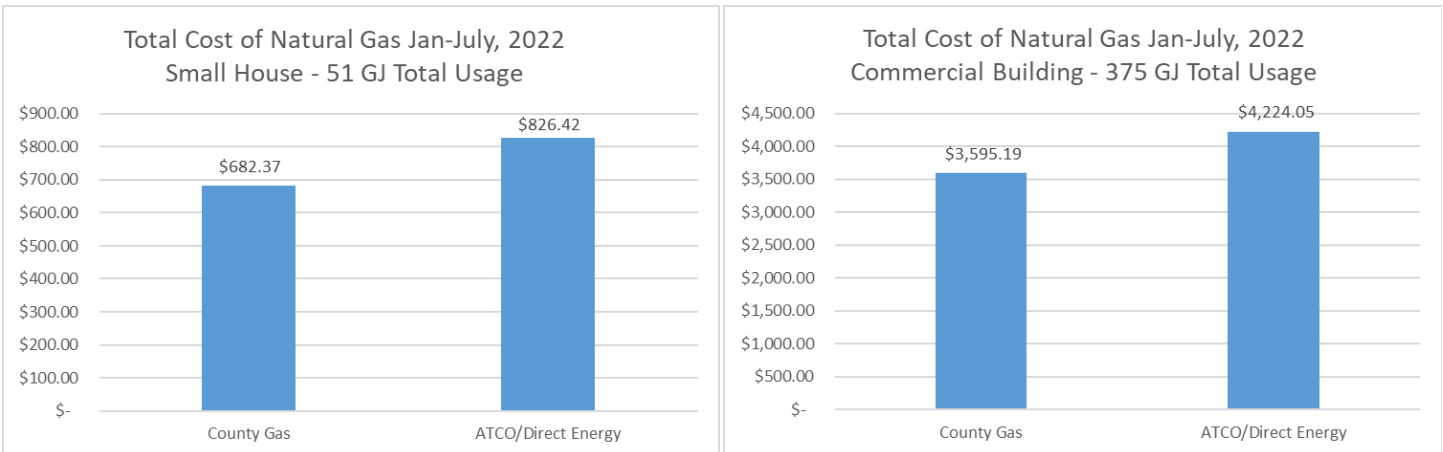


NATURAL GAS UTILITY

WHOLESALE GAS RATES AND GAS PRICE CAP

Due to high wholesale gas rates, the Government of Alberta has announced a cap of \$6.50/GJ on natural gas rates from October 2022—March 2023. We expect this to come in the form of a rebate issued to customers. However, we have unfortunately not yet received any specific information from the Government on how this will be rolled out. Gas rates remain volatile and it is uncertain at this point whether or not wholesale prices will climb higher than \$6.50/GJ this winter. It is important to note that this cap applies to Wholesale Price only, not the Carbon Tax or the County Gas Rate. We hope to be able to provide specific information to customers with the September Gas Bills.

The County gas rates have not changed since 2018 and remain among the lowest in the province, significantly lower than the investor-owned utilities such as ATCO.



CALL NOW TO BOOK YOUR GAS SERVICE

We are pleased to offer numerous affordable services to our customers including Primary and Secondary Gas Services for homes, shops, generators, BBQ hook-ups, grain dryers, and more. We also offer plowing and trenching for utilities such as electrical, water and sewer.

Rates for Gas Services

Rural under 200 feet—\$2,500

Rural over 200 feet—\$7,500 minimum (County funds 25% of cost over \$7,500)

Urban—\$2,500

Convert Secondary to Primary—\$1,000 minimum

Grain Dryer—Individual quote based on actual cost estimate

Secondaries, plowing, trenching, other—Individual quote based on actual cost estimate



WHY SUBMIT A FIRST CALL?

We often get inquiries directly to our office to locate gas lines. While we are happy to locate your primary gas line and do our best to locate any secondary gas lines we are aware of on your property, it is important to do this through the Alberta One Call/Click Before You Dig process for the following reasons:

- 1) To ensure that all underground facility owners (Electric, Telephone, Oil & Gas) are notified and can locate their lines if necessary. It is very common for property owners to be unaware or forget about underground facilities on their property.
- 2) To protect yourself, and the County, against liability for damaged lines. The One Call/Click Before You Dig system reduces your liability by ensuring that proper records are kept, all applicable facility owners are notified, and you are provided with all of the information required to dig safely.
- 3) It's the rules. All facility owners who participate in One Call/Click Before You Dig are obligated to locate lines only through the System.
- 4) It's free. All locating is done free of charge. In the case of electricity and telephone they may not locate all lines on your property free of charge, particularly secondary lines. But the County will make all efforts to locate any and all secondary gas lines on your property.
