Council Corner

With seeding preparations in full swing, we were happy to see spring rains come sooner rather than later.

On March 5, 2024, Council hosted a Spring Open House at the Kitscoty Community Hall. We had positive feedback with the Agriculture and Environment Department hosting an information session on agriculture funding opportunities (Resilient Agriculture Landscape Program and ALUS-Vermilion River) as well the Vermilion and Kitscoty RCMP Detachments and Rural Crime Watch attended to provide information. Rural crime and the safety of the County remains a top concern of Council. Council meets with RCMP officials during the RMA conferences to discuss the importance and the valuable roles the Vermilion, Kitscoty and Onion Lake RCMP detachments provide to the County and region.

Council continues to lobby the Provincial government to provide better accuracy on oil and gas assessment. Council is actively seeking out and exploring solutions, including meeting with government officials on a regular basis to keep this issue in the forefront. The 2024 County of Vermilion River Corporate Plan, which is available on the County Website and at the County office, has helped to guide Council through some of the complicated issues we are facing in our economy. As Council continues to strategically look for ways to meet the current financial crunch, it does so with all of our friends and neighbours in mind as we know everyone is feeling the financial pressures of our current realities.

Council conducts its Regular Meetings and Policy and Priorities Committee Meetings in person and through ZOOM webinars. We encourage residents to register (see the link on our webpage) to attend these meetings. It is encouraging to note some residents have adjusted to the virtual council meetings and are participating and joining in on a regular basis.

REGULATED WEED HERBICIDE REBATE **PROGRAM**

This program is an incentive to assist landowners in controlling specified noxious weeds on range and pasture lands and headlands/fence lines within the Municipality



To qualify for the herbicide rebate, CVR landowners must be controlling specified noxious weeds with approved on-label herbicides registered to control that weed. Specified weeds for this Rebate include:

- ✓ Yellow toadflax $\overline{\mathbf{A}}$
- Common tansv
- Ox-eye daisy
 Leafy spurge
 Scentless chamomile

 W Knapweeds
 White cockle
 Hoary alyssum

To access the rebate, landowners must apply in advance to the Agriculture and Environment Department who will determine program eligibility. Upon completion, submit a copy of the herbicide receipts to the Agriculture Department. The rebate covers 50% of the herbicide purchase cost to a maximum of \$1000 per landowner per year. Agriculture Department staff have discretion to approve or deny applications within budget limits set by Council.

WEED WARRIORS PROGRAM

This is an opportunity for non-profit and community groups in our municipality to help combat noxious weeds like scentless chamomile or burdock. A \$500 donation to each group for their assistance will be provided. We will also offer two bonus incentives: \$100 for the group that picks the most weeds by weight and \$100 for the group with the most team spirit. Opportunities may be limited by scheduling and budget.

The Agriculture and Environment department have discretion to approve or deny applications with in budge limits set by Council.
